## Making Life Hacks Work for You (Proverbs 1:1-7)

## 1. One of the greatest humans to learn life hacks from is (v.1)

- The human author of Proverbs is King Solomon, the son of David.
- The positive about Solomon: When Solomon became king, God appeared to him and invited him to ask for anything (1 Kings 3:5).
  Solomon asked for wisdom (1 Kings 3:6-15).
- 1 Kings 4:29-32 And God gave Solomon wisdom and understanding beyond measure, and breadth of mind like the sand on the seashore, so that Solomon's wisdom surpassed the wisdom of all the people.... He also spoke 3000 proverbs, and his songs were 1005.
- The negative about Solomon: In his later years, Solomon did not follow his own proverbs. He ended up valuing women more than his relationship with God amassing 700 wives and 300 concubines who turned his heart away from the Lord. Solomon started worshipping false gods (1 Kings 11:1-8).
- Application #1 As we study the book of Proverbs together, I am making a choice to learn from both the positive and negative of Solomon's life. I declare upfront that this will not just become head knowledge for me. I confess that knowledge by itself puffs up (1 Corinthians 8:1). But, with God's help and power, I choose true wisdom by applying these proverbs to my life and by acting on them in obedience to God and His ways.

Sidenote: King Solomon wrote the majority of Proverbs (1:1-9:18; 10:1-22:16; 25:1-29:27). The proverbs in 25:1-29:27 were selected from Solomon's collection by King Hezekiah's committee (25:1). Chapter 30 was written by Agur; Chapter 31 was written by Lemuel.

			cause it's only through a relationship with the Lord that one can		
		be	wise. The fear of – the reverence for – Yahweh is the beginning		

of wisdom. Fools despise wisdom and discipline, but the wise

person is the one who fears, trusts, and reverences Yahweh. This is the first step and the essential component in gaining wisdom – the fear of the Lord. The everyday decisions that we make are to be done in the fear of the Lord, and the everyday decisions we make reveal whether or not we fear the Lord. God is concerned with your whole life. How you eat dinner, how you finish tasks assigned to you, how you spend money, how you parent your kids, and how you respond to your parents are all before the Lord. Every nook and cranny of your life is to be governed by God."

- Psalm 25:14 The friendship of the Lord is for those who fear Him
- 1 Corinthians 1:30 Jesus Christ became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption.
- Matthew 12:42 Someone greater than Solomon is here.
- Colossians 2:3 In Christ are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.
- John Piper: "Jesus is the foundation of all true wisdom. We would not have any wisdom without Him. Proverbs would hang useless in our mouths without Jesus. We would have an appearance of wisdom but be of no eternal use to anyone. But since Jesus secured God's wisdom for us, we can be truly wise. And that would mean glorifying God in all we do. For that is why Jesus came."
- Jonathan Akin: "What if wisdom wasn't a concept or an idea or a set of ideas you had to learn at all? What if Wisdom was a Person you could know and have a relationship with? What if Wisdom was a Person you could love and walk with, and just by knowing, loving, and walking with this Person it would actually make you wise? What if Wisdom was a Person who spoke to you, and by listening to Wisdom's voice you could actually grow in wisdom? Proverbs will teach us that Wisdom is a Person Jesus Christ of Nazareth. Through a relationship with Him you can be reconciled to God, to others, and to the world around you. Through a relationship with Him, He will begin to produce in you the wisdom He lives out the wisdom of Proverbs!"
- This makes Proverbs 1:1 fascinating: "son of David, king of Israel"
- Fun Bible study on "Son of David": Matthew 1:1; 9:27; 15:22; 20:30; 21:9; Luke 1:30-33
- Application #3 The #1 way to get wisdom is to invite Jesus Christ, son of David, King of Israel into your life!! Which starts with believing in His death and resurrection (Romans 10:9).

Jesus, You are Wisdom, and I receive You into my life. Thank You, Jesus, for dying on the cross in my place for my sins. Thank You for rising from the dead defeating sin, death, and the devil. I receive You into my life. I receive Your forgiveness of my sins. I receive Your free gift of eternal life. And I receive the gift of Your Spirit who will guide me into all wisdom and truth.
