We Have a Future Hope (5:1-8)

- "We have this ministry...We have this treasure... We have the same Spirit of Faith... We have a building of God" (2 Cor. 4:1, 7, 13; 5:1). What a testimony Paul gave to the reality of Christian faith!
- This "building of God" is not the believer's heavenly home, promised in John 14:1-6. It is his glorified body.
- Paul was a tent maker (Acts 18:1-3). Here he uses a tent as a
 picture of our present earthly bodies. A tent is weak, temporary
 structure, without much beauty; but the glorified body we will
 receive will be eternal, beautiful, and never show signs of
 weakness or decay (Phil. 3:20-21)
- A key to biblical *effectiveness* is eternal *confidence*. (John 17:3; Rom. 8:28, 38-19; Heb. 10:24-25)
- C.S. Lewis: "If you read history, you will find that the Christians
 who did the most for the present world were precisely those
 who thought the most of the next."

- Paul is contrasting what is *earthly* vs. what is *eternal*.
 - Tent = Earthly home; human bodies
 - Building = Eternal home; future resurrection bodies
 - Naked = Soul with no body
- The reality: In this tent, we groan. Why?
 - We want better bodies. Actually, perfected bodies.
- And it will happen! (Verses 4-5)
 - o 1 Corinthians 15:54 Death swallowed up in victory
- Holy Spirit = Guarantee
 - Charles Spurgeon: "The work of the Holy Spirit in the soul is the bud of heaven."
 - Already, but Not Yet

2. Our "	" is With the Lord (v. 6	3-8
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- "What does it mean to be "home with the Lord?" (Opinions)
 - 1. Spirit is with Jesus, then the body is later
 - 2. Timeless eternity, already in eternal bodies
- Regardless: Paul was excited for this day, not another waiting period.
- Verse 7: We walk by faith, and not by sight.
 - A confident trust in God's promises for the future, even if you can't see it.
- John Piper: "The critical question for our generation—and for every generation—is this: If you could have heaven, with no sickness, and with all the friends you ever had on earth, and all the food you ever liked, and all the leisure activities you ever enjoyed, and all the natural beauties you ever saw, all the physical pleasures you ever tasted, and no human conflict or any natural disasters, could you be satisfied with heaven, if Christ were not there?"
- Application #2: Ask: What are you most excited about? (Tent or Home) And where is your emphasis? (Home or With the Lord)
