3 Types of Old Testament Laws

Type of Law	Definition	Examples	Repeated in NT?
Civil	Laws to bring order to citizenship in nation of Israel	If you steal, you must return original plus 20 percent. Capital punishment for rebellious teenagers.	No
Ceremonial	Rituals of sacrifice; rituals that made Israel distinct	Animal sacrifices; kosher: don't eat shrimp or pork; don't wear blended fabrics; don't get tattoos	No
Moral	Commandments regarding what is good, right, holy	Ten Commandments. Commandments regarding sexuality.	Yes

The Bible makes it clear that New Testament (new covenant) believers are no longer under the civil and ceremonial laws of the old covenant (Romans 7:1-6; Galatians 3:24-26; Mark 7:19; Acts 10:15; 1 Timothy 4:4-5). But, the moral laws of the Old Testament are repeated in the New Testament, and the Bible calls new covenant believers to follow these commandments.

Outline of Leviticus 19-20

- **19:1-2; 20:7-8; 20:26 – Main point: Be holy, for I am holy.**
- **19:3-4 – Moral** – Three of the ten commandments: honor parents, keep Sabbath, no idols.
- **19:5-8 – Ceremonial** – Offer peace offering in a holy manner.
- **19:9-18 – Moral** – Love your neighbor as yourself. Commandments regarding immigrants, the poor, stealing, lying, swearing, oppression, slander, hatred, and vengeance.
- **19:19 – Ceremonial** – Animal, seed, and fabric blending.
- **19:20-22 – Moral and Civil** – Sexual sin in the workplace.
- **19:23-25 – Ceremonial** – Crops in your new land.
- **19:26a – Moral** – Do not eat blood (Acts 15:20).

- **19:26b,31; 20:6,27 – Moral** – Prohibitions against magic, sorcery, fortune-telling, omens, and consulting the dead.
- **19:27-28 – Ceremonial** – Prohibitions against certain haircuts, body cuts, or tattoos (the customs of the pagan nations around them).
- **19:29 – Moral** – Do not make your daughter a prostitute.
- **19:30 – Moral** – Keep God's Sabbath.
- **19:32-37 – Moral** – Loving treatment of others – the elderly, immigrants, honesty. Obey God's commandments.
- **20:1-21 – Civil** – Capital offenses and/or excommunication offenses: child sacrifice (vv.1-5), sorcery (v.6), cursing parents (v.9), adultery, incest, same sex sexual relations, bestiality (vv.10-21).
- **20:22-27 – Summary: Be holy, for I the Lord am holy.** Keep all of my statutes and be set apart from all the nations around you.

Let's Talk About Tattoos (19:28)

- Leviticus 19:28 forbids tattoos. Is this a ceremonial or moral law?
- **Application #1** – Make these 4 considerations before getting a tattoo:
 - (1) Obey your parents until you are an independent adult (Eph. 6:1-3);
 - (2) Consult your spouse because your body belongs to her as well (1 Corinthians 7:1-5);
 - (3) Ask: Does the image or word I'm considering on my skin glorify God? (1 Corinthians 10:31)
 - (4) Ask: Will my tattoo cause anyone to whom I am ministering to stumble? (1 Corinthians 8:13).

Let's Talk About Magic and Sorcery (19:26,31; 20:6,27)

- Leviticus 19:26,31; 20:6,27 clearly forbid engaging in magic, witchcraft, sorcery, fortunetelling, omens, and consulting the dead (see also Deuteronomy 18:10-12). These are clearly moral commands that are repeated in the New Testament (Galatians 5:20; Revelation 21:8; 22:15).
- Michael Houdmann: “Sorcery, the use of spells, divination, or speaking to spirits are clearly condemned in the Bible. They are an attempt to bypass God's wisdom and power and give glory to Satan instead. God has no tolerance for sorcery.”
- **Application #2** – If you have engaged any of the following practices, repent and renounce them using this prayer:

“Lord, I confess that I have participated in _____. I acknowledge that doing so was evil and offensive in your sight. I am sorry, and I repent. I thank You for forgiving me through shed blood of Jesus Christ on the cross. I renounce any and all involvement with _____, and I cancel out all ground that the enemy gained in my life through this activity. In Jesus' name. Amen.”

What It Means to Love People According to Leviticus 19:9-18

1. I love people by sharing _____ with them (vv.9-10)

- **Matthew 25:35,40** – *I was hungry and you gave me food. I was thirsty and you gave me drink.... As you did it to one of the least of these My brothers, you did it to Me.*
- And we love, not just the poor, but our family, neighbors, friends, and coworkers by sharing food and a meal with them.
- **Application #3** – With God's help and power, I am going to...

2. I love people by not _____ from them or _____ to them (vv.11-12)

- **Application #4** – Is there anything that I have borrowed from someone that I need to return? Are there any questionable practices in my workplace that I need to stop? Is there anyone that I need to confess a lie to? I choose to stop lying in order to make myself "look good" or "feel less awkward" – I commit to tell the truth or to not speak at all.

3. I love people by treating them _____ (vv.13-15)

- **Application #5** – Am I treating anyone in my life unfairly and unjustly? How does God want to use me to right any injustices in our society?
- **Proverbs 17:15** (NLT) – *Acquitting the guilty and condemning the innocent – both are detestable to the Lord.*
- Two organizations working for biblical justice in our society:

4. I love people by not _____ (v.16)

- **Proverbs 26:22** (The Message) – *Listening to gossip is like eating cheap candy; do you want junk like that in your belly?*
- **Proverbs 16:27-28** (The Message) – *Mean people spread mean gossip; their words smart and burn.... Gossips break up friendships.*
- **James 4:11** (The Message) – *Don't bad-mouth each other.*
- **Application #6** – With God's help and power, I commit to build others up with my words (Ephesians 4:29) rather than talking behind their backs.

5. I love people by _____ with them (vv.17-18)

- God puts the obligation of initiating reconciliation on you:
 - If you have hurt someone, you are to go to them and apologize (Matthew 5:23-24).
 - If someone has hurt you, you are to go to them and speak the truth in love (Matthew 18:15; Ephesians 4:15).
- **Romans 12:18** – *If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.*
- **Application #7** – With God's help and power, I will forgive those who have hurt me and will seek reconciliation as God leads as far as it depends on me.
