### Why Study the Book of Leviticus?

• Exodus 40:34-35; Leviticus 1:1; Numbers 1:1



Leviticus 1:1	Numbers 1:1
The Lord called to Moses <b>FROM</b> the tent.	The Lord spoke to Moses IN the tent.
Moses is <i>outside</i> of God's Presence.	Moses is <i>in</i> God's Presence.

- Question: How do you move from OUTSIDE the tent to INSIDE the tent? How do you move from OUTSIDE God's Presence to IN God's Presence? How do you move from Leviticus 1:1 to Numbers 1:1?
- Answer: The Book of Leviticus
- Tim Mackie: Moses' inability to enter the tent is an image of the relational
  rift between God and Israel. How can God's people, who have proven
  selfish and rebellious, be reconciled to the holy God? That's what the
  book of Leviticus is all about how God graciously provides a way for
  sinful, corrupt people to live in His holy Presence."

- Hebrews 12:14 Without holiness no one will see the Lord.
- The theme of the Book of Leviticus is holiness.
- Five times God says: "Be holy, for I am holy" (Lev. 11:44,45; 19:2; 20:7,26)
- Holiness is how we move from outside the tent (God's Presence) to in the tent (God's Presence).

#### What is Holiness?

- Dr. Evans: "The holiness of God is His intrinsic and transcendent purity, the standard of righteousness to which the whole universe must conform. God does not conform to any standard created by others. He *is* the standard."
- qadowsh (kaw-doshe') = sacred; holy; set apart
- AW Tozer: "Holy is the way God is. To be holy He does not conform to a standard. He <u>is</u> the standard. He is absolutely holy with an infinite, incomprehensible fullness of purity that is incapable of being other than it is. Because He is holy, His attributes are holy; that is, whatever we think of as belonging to God must be thought of as holy."
- Bill Bright: "Of all of God's attributes, nothing compares to the splendor and beauty of His holiness. It is chief among His attributes. That means His character is perfect in every way. God is totally pure. His moral excellence is the absolute standard of integrity and ethical purity for all within His universe. God's supreme holiness infinitely sets Him apart from His creation. Everything God does bears the imprint of His holiness. His holiness never diminishes."
- Revelation 4:6-8 Around the throne on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with the face of a man, and the fourth living creature like an eagle in flight. And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and within, and day and night they never cease to say, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!"
- AW Tozer: "God is holy, and He has made holiness the moral condition necessary to the health of His universe."

# **Houston, We Have a Problem**

- Romans 3:23 All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.
- Isaiah 53:6 We all like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way.
- Romans 6:23 The wages of sin is death.
- Hebrews 12:14 Without holiness no one will see the Lord.
- We are outside of the tent and separated from God's holy Presence. How can we get in?

#### The Book of Leviticus Has the Answer to Our Problem

# The Most Important Part of Leviticus

- The most important part of Leviticus is Chapters 16-17 The Day of Atonement. The whole book hinges (literally) on these central chapters as the chiastic structure wraps around them. The reason that Moses (and you and I) can go into the tent (God's Holy Presence) is because of what these chapters point to the sacrificial and scapegoat atonement of the coming Messiah, Jesus Christ (Lev. 16:5-10,15,20-22)
- **2 Corinthians 5:21** God made Jesus who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.
- 1 Peter 3:18 Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive by the Spirit.

- Holiness does not come from imitation but from inhabitation.
- Bill Bright: "This is the secret: We can live a holy life if we yield to the
  Holy Spirit who came to glorify Jesus Christ. Jesus is the only person to
  ever live a holy life, and now He resides within every believer through His
  Holy Spirit. His presence and power give us the strength to live a holy life
  moment by moment."
- Miles Stanford (The Complete Green Letters): "All spiritual life and growth is based upon the principle of position. Our position, the source of our Christian life, is perfect. When we received the Lord Jesus as our personal Savior, the Holy Spirit caused us to be born into Him. He created us anew in the position that was established through Christ's work on the cross. We are a new creation. This is the eternal position in which every believer has been placed, whether he is aware of it or not. Our condition is what we are in our Christian walk, in which we develop from infancy to maturity. Although our position remains unchangeable, our condition is variable. Through the exercise of faith, our eternal position affects our daily condition, but in no way does our condition affect that heavenly position. If the believer does not know of his position in the Lord Jesus, and how to abide in Him as his very life, there will be but one result. He will struggle in his un-Christ-like condition rather than rest in his Christ-centered position."
